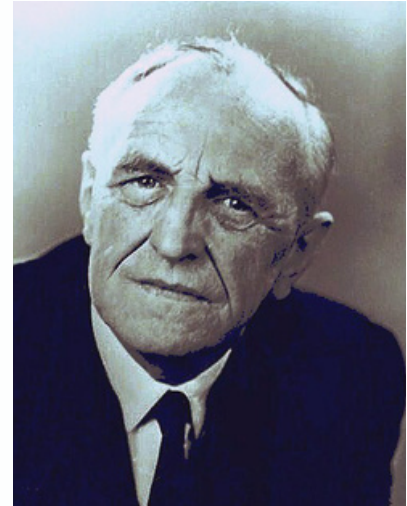


WINNICOTT THEORY COURSE

FACILITATOR:

Nichi Casati is a Clinical Psychologist in private practice. She has been an active member of IPCP since its inception in 1998 She has taught Infant Observation for 17 years, as well as all the components of the Certificate Course.

COURSE:

In these six introductory lectures, Winnicott is situated in his historic context and his contributions to psychoanalytic theory and practice are considered. Several key papers are read which show how Winnicott evolved his own theory of the early developmental process and the mothers' contribution to it. His papers on his theory of early infant development up to adolescence are discussed, as well as his papers on transitional phenomena, his theory on play, and theory of the True Self and False Self, and the antisocial personality. His interest in transitional space and play as a fundamental component of creative living through his influential paper, "Transitional Phenomena and Objects" is discussed.
